

The Nassau County Clerk of the Circuit Court and Comptroller's Office announces our participation in the launch a statewide initiative: the "Hope Card." The Hope Card is offered to individuals who have been issued a final injunction for protection against various forms of domestic violence.

The Hope Card is a digital or wallet-sized card that contains important information regarding the injunction for protection including the petitioner's name and birthdate, the respondent's name and birthdate, and other information such as the type of injunction and end date. These cards are intended to give victims a quick and easily recognizable form of proof for law enforcement to keep them safe from violations of their injunctions.

Hope Cards will be valid for two years or until the injunction ends, whichever comes first, but may be renewed if the injunction remains in effect.
